



31st Annual Lighted Yacht Parade, December 1, 2007

The 31st Annual Lighted Yacht Parade will take place Saturday, December 1, 2007 along the waterfront of the Oakland/Alameda Estuary (see attached diagram of parade route). The parade will begin just after sunset (around 5:30pm), and this year's theme is "A Child's Christmas."

Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place for the Best Decorated Power Boat and the Best Decorated Sail Boat. The first place winners in each category will receive lunch for 4 at an Oakland Fire House. This unique day includes a wonderful lunch prepared by the Oakland Firefighters and a tour of their station. A grand prize will also be awarded for the Best Overall Decorated Boat. This year's grand prize winner will receive a High Definition, Flat Screen TV. Judges will evaluate boats based on representation of this year's theme, the number of lights, creativity in decorations, costumes, and music. Spectators can watch the parade from any waterside restaurant along the estuary. Public viewing areas will also be available at Wind River Park in Alameda and Jack London Square in Oakland.

The Lighted Yacht Parade is hosted and organized by the Encinal Yacht Club, the Oakland Yacht Club, and the Marina Village Yacht Harbor. The organizing committee is excited to announce that this year D'Anna Yachts, John Beery Yachts, and the Port of Oakland have joined as event sponsors. The additional sponsorships enable the committee to expand promotion, increase participation, improve participant prizes, and generated more charitable donations.

Similar to past years, the parade partners with the Oakland Firefighters Random Acts of Kindness Toys for Tots program and the Alameda County Community Food Bank. Participants and spectators are encouraged to donate food, new unwrapped toys, or money at the designated drop sites located at each host's facility. These donations go a long way toward providing food and toys to deserving kids and families during the holiday season.

Each year on the first Saturday in December, the Lighted Yacht Parade kicks off the holiday season. Bay Area boat owners share in the holiday spirit by decorating their boats and participating in the parade. Hundreds of spectators gather along the waterfront at specified viewing areas or at restaurants that afford them a view of the estuary. Last year 35 boats participated in the parade, and this year's organizers expect even more.

Completed entry forms must be returned with the \$30 entry fee and a \$25 refundable deposit for the parade numbers by November 29, 2007. This year, in addition to a skipper's bag with gifts, participants will also receive a photograph of their decorated boat.

A Skipper's Meeting is scheduled for Thursday November 29th, at 6:00 PM. at the Encinal Yacht Club, located at 1251 Pacific Marina in Alameda. The parade route will be reviewed and participant numbers will be assigned. Those who cannot make the meeting are welcome to pick up their number and parade instructions at the Encinal Yacht Club office during regular business hours (Tuesday-Saturday, 9:00-5:00) any time after November 29th.

The Encinal Yacht Club is the third oldest yacht club on the San Francisco Bay. The Club's mission is to foster and encourage a love of yachting and racing, aquatic and other sports, and to promote the health and pleasure of its members through social interaction.
